Dress Requirements

Suitable golf attire is required and sun smart clothing must be considered.

Golf Shoes On Course: Soft spikes only.

Buggies On Greens It is permissible to take buggies across a green and, if this is done, players should not go near the hole. Players are requested to spread the wear on greens. Under no circumstances should buggies be left on greens whilst putting. Nor should buggies be taken across tees.

Use of Golf Carts in Competitions

- Golf Carts can be used in all events conducted by the Shepparton Golf Club
- All hire carts will be used in accordance with the hiring contract from the Pro Shop. Private Carts (see below)
- The SGC Professional reserves the right to cancel use of the cart on the course for misuse
- The SGC Head Curator (or his delegate) reserves the right to cancel use of all carts (both private and hire) due to inclement weather or course conditions. This decision may be made in conjunction with the Club Captain and the SGC Professional
- Events conducted by external bodies such as the GVDGA, GVLGA, VGA, PGA etc will follow the rules regarding cart use as stated by that body conducting their event at SGC
- Carts must only be driven in specified areas around the greens. Please observe cart "lines" and signs

Private Golf Carts -Requirements of the SGC

*The definition of a Golf Cart also includes the use of any motorized vehicle designed to carry golf clubs and golfer will herein be referred to as a Golf Cart within this syllabus.

*Current medical certificate - stating precise reason for needing a cart, is required

*Current liability insurance must be provided. Proof supplied annually to the SGC by 1st July. The operator is responsible for operating the cart in a safe and careful manner and is liable for damage to persons or property caused by operator's negligence

*Cart must be maintained in sound condition

*The Committee reserves the right to limit the occasions and competitions in which motorised vehicles may be used. Advice will be communicated through the Pro Shop on a daily basis.

*The Committee retains the authority to cancel any member's licence if it feels there is improper use

*Private carts are for exclusive use by the owner only. Refer to Cart Policy (available from the office)

*Upon sale of the cart, the storage right of the carts does not go with the sale

Playing Rights

ALL PLAYERS MUST REPORT TO THE PRO SHOP PRIOR TO PLAYING

Members - are reminded that their rights to play on the course are not restricted, except for the days listed in this programme as "Open" or GVDGA, GVLGA events, Charity or Trade Days

Conduct of Competitions and Conditions of Entry

1. All competitors must be available for starting fifteen (15) minutes before the appointed time
2. Twelve players are required before trophies can be played for – one grade
3. Visitors may, at the discretion of the Match Committee play in club events on payment of required fees
4. Unfinancial members are not eligible for competition from 1st October 2017
5. Grades: 0-11 players – no comp. Players who pay their competition fee will still be handicapped, however competition entry fee will be credited back to

their account if there are less than 12 competitors; 12 -34 - 1 grade; 35 to 90 players – 2 grades;
91 + players – 3 grades

6. The Match Committee reserve the right to alter grade divisions

Entry Fees

Competition entry fees will be set by the Match Committee and ratified by the General Committee. Fees are subject to change during the golfing year.

Junior Golf

Junior membership is applicable to children under the age of 18 years. Children under the age of 12 years may play the course in the company of their parents or members as designated by the Match Committee at no cost. Junior members may be given permission to compete in all events on application to the Match Committee.

Junior clinics will be held throughout the year. Check with the Pro Shop and on the Club website for further details.

Procedure in the Event Of A Tied Match

Halved match or stroke play ties shall be replayed unless the Match Committee considers otherwise. For expediency, the following guidelines will be considered by the Match Committee.

In the event of a tie;

1. MATCH PLAY –
 - (a) SCRATCH EVENTS: A match which ends all square shall be continued hole by hole from the hole where the match began until one side wins a hole.
 - (b) HANDICAP EVENTS: As in Scratch Events, but with the strokes being allowed as if the match has been recommenced.

2. STROKE PLAY –
 - (a) For 18 hole events the best score for the last 9 holes shall be used, if there is still a tie, the last 6 holes or if still tied the last 3 holes. If a tie still persists then hole by hole from the 18th.
 - (b) In 27, 36, 54 and 72 hole events the last 18 holes shall be used and if still tied count back as in (a) above.
 - (c) In handicap events the relevant handicap or fraction thereof shall be applied.

- (d) Where a penalty applicable under rule 3-5 of the Rules of Golf is applied to a result this penalty shall be ignored so far as the count back is concerned.

NOTE: For a 9 hole event the best score for the last 6 holes shall be used if there is still a tie the last 3 holes if a tie still persists then hole by hole from the 9th hole.

Handicaps

Members without handicaps are required to lodge three completed cards. For all events, handicaps will be as at the day of play.

In mixed Canadian Foursomes events, handicap is 3/8 of the combined handicap of players.

Handicapping System

The handicap system used in Australia was changed on 23rd January 2014 to incorporate the use of Slope. Under Slope, the golfer's playing handicap on any given day will be determined according to the difficulty of the tees or course to be played. A Golf Australia handicap will be calculated by using the best eight of players most recent twenty scores.

This may result in fluctuations of a golfer's handicap from round to round depending on the course rating. Please be patient in accepting fluctuations to your handicap. Please refer to the Golf Australia website for finer details at www.golf.org.au

Rules Of Play For Club Championships

All Club Championship grades will consist of two qualifying rounds of eighteen holes of stroke play, followed by Match Play. In the (Open and Ladies) Club Championships, the 8th qualifier will be decided by a sudden death playoff on the Sunday morning prior to the quarterfinals commencing. In B, C, D grades all ties for qualifiers will be decided by countback. All matches are over 18 holes except the final of the Open Club Championship, which will be over 36 holes. Eligibility to compete in the Club Championships requires an SGC member (who may have a second club membership), to have played a minimum of ninety (90) individual handicapped holes at the Shepparton Golf Club in the twelve months prior to the day of the event. In exceptional circumstances, permission to compete may be granted on application to the Match Committee. (e.g. a new player who has recently obtained a GA Handicap for the first time).

Eight qualifier will contest the Open, B, C & D Grade Championships. At the completion of the first qualifying round, the Match Committee will assess the handicaps of competitors who have entered the Championships and will attempt to ensure that there is a balanced

number of participants in each grade. The Match Committee reserves the right to alter the handicap sections based on the number of entrants contesting the Championships.

Should a player from a lower grade qualify for the Open Event, following the 2nd qualifying round, that player will have the option of contesting the Open Championship. This player must inform the Captain (or their representative) on the day of completing the 2nd qualifying round of their intention to play in the Open Event.

All play will be under medal round conditions. Players commencing in Open, B, C or D divisions will remain in that division, for the remainder of the Championships.

Junior Championship

The Junior Champion will be decided by the best aggregate score over the two qualifying rounds by players under 18 years of age at date of the first round.

Veteran Championship

The Veteran Champion will be decided by the best aggregate score over two qualifying rounds by a player aged 55 years or over at the date of the first round.

Honour Board Events

GMCU Fourball, Captain's Trophy, RSL Trophy, Legacy Trophy, H.F. Lightfoot Mixed Canadian Foursomes, Lawton Family Perpetual Trophy.

Special Events

Medallist of the Year to be played in conjunction with Lawton Family Perpetual Trophy in September. Twelve medal winners to play off, lowest Nett score on the day to be the winner. Trophy to be known as the LAWTON FAMILY PERPETUAL TROPHY.

Eligibility to compete in the Lawton Family Perpetual Trophy requires a male member (who may have a second club membership) to have played a minimum of ninety (90) individual handicapped holes (excluding handicap cards) at the Shepparton Golf Club in the twelve months prior to the day of event. A member is still eligible to win a monthly medal, but must meet the minimum requirements prior to the "Medallist of the Year" event.

Shepparton Fourball

Trophies provided by the sponsor – **GMCU**. Eligibility to compete in the Shepparton Fourball requires each male member (who may have a second club membership) to have played a minimum of ninety (90) individual handicapped holes (excluding handicap cards)

at the Shepparton Golf Club in the twelve months prior to the day of event. In exceptional circumstances, permission to compete may be granted on application to the Match Committee.

The timesheet is available to be filled in the Pro Shop for the qualifying round. All play is under medal round conditions. The leading 32 pairs qualify for knockout match play. The lowest marker in each qualified match reduces to scratch and other players reduce their handicaps by the same number of strokes. The match is fourball best ball handicap match play. Maximum handicap is 36.

Summer Fourball & HF Lightfoot Mixed Canadian Foursomes

Eligibility to compete in the Summer Fourball & HF Lightfoot requires each member (who may have a second club membership) to have played a minimum of ninety (90) individual handicapped holes (excluding handicap cards) at the Shepparton Golf Club in the twelve months prior to the day of event. In exceptional circumstances, permission to compete may be granted on application to the Match Committee.

Murray Slee

Eligibility to compete in the Murray Slee requires a member (who may have a second club membership) to have played a minimum of ninety (90) individual handicapped holes (excluding handicap cards) at the Shepparton Golf Club in the twelve months prior to the day of event. In exceptional circumstances, permission to compete may be granted on application to the Match Committee.

Course Record

Medal rounds, Shepparton Open and Club Championships are the only rounds where the course record may be challenged (off blue plates)

Chicken Run

Daylight saving months. A 9 hole Stableford event will be conducted on Wednesdays. In conjunction with this event, a special competition will be conducted by the Club Professional with a final to be played at the conclusion of daylight savings. Entry in this event is on a weekly basis and points accrue towards qualifying for the final.

Medal Rounds

Medal rounds are played from the back tees over the full length of the course (blue tees)

Rules for Ambrose Play

A team stroke event usually played by a group of four, but can be any number as designated by the Match Committee. Each player plays a tee shot at each hole. The team captain then selects the best drive which is then played by its owner. The other members retrieve their golf balls and in turn place within one club length of the selected position and play their second shots. This procedure of selecting the best position continues until a ball is holed. When on the green, balls are placed on the selected spot. The score for the team on each hole is the accumulated score of the team. In the interest of speedy play, it is imperative that each team appoints a team captain (usually the lowest marker) whose duty it is to select the ball to be played and generally to direct the order of play of the other players in the team.

Starting Time Sheets

Members are encouraged to use the on-line booking system via the Shepparton Golf Club website or Shepparton Golf Club TeamApp. Members can book or cancel their tee times up until midnight prior to the day of event using this system. After midnight on the day of event, members will have to contact the Pro Shop directly to book or cancel their tee time on 5821 2531. Pro Shop trading hours: - Standard time: Monday – Friday (8am-5.30pm), Saturday/Sunday (7am – 5.30pm)

Daylight Saving time: Monday-Friday (8am-7pm), Saturday/Sunday (7am-7pm)

Hole In One

On the occasion of a member having a hole in one during the competition, the President or the Captain of the Club may suitably celebrate with the member present.

Practice

Practice on the course is not permitted at any time. A member may play a round hitting a second ball.

The Club Professional may choose to provide lessons on the course when space permits.

As a means of providing Junior Development, the Match Committee or Club Professional may allow times and permits for juniors to progress their game.

On the practice fairway, play should only be from designated areas and be limited to 6, 7, 8 & 9 irons and wedge.

Complaints

All complaints should be made in writing to the Secretary, who, if unable to satisfy the complainant, will submit the complaint to the Executive Committee. Forms are available in the Walter Lee lounge.

No member shall directly reprimand an employee of the Club.

Car Parking

Members are requested to strictly observe the parking rules. The areas marked for the Committee of the Club are reserved for them at all times.

Parking bays in front of the motel are for motel guests only.

Members' Guests and Visitors

Members' guests and visitors are welcome at Shepparton Golf Club and are asked to comply with the Club's dress and behavioural code. There are special rates for playing golf for members' guests.

Liquor

The SGC is the holder of a Full Club Licence and can trade daily. The hours are determined by the management but generally the bar is open from 11am to 7pm. These hours may be varied according to demand. The sale of liquor to persons under age of 18 years is not permitted. The SGC follows the Liquor Control Reform Act, 1988. Liquor purchased elsewhere is not permitted to be consumed on course, or in the clubhouse. **The consumption of liquor on the course should be limited so as not to cause disruption to play or offence to fellow golfers.**

SGC Balcony BBQ

Bookings must be made with the office. All liquor must be purchased from the Bar. Strictly no BYO. Cleaning fees apply - check upon booking.

LADY MEMBERS

Club Competition

Wednesday is Ladies' Club Competition day. 18 hole rounds, as designated in the syllabus, will

be played in three divisions. A – Grade is 0 – 22, B – Grade is 23 – 29 and C – Grade is 30 – 45.

Ties will be decided by a countback. Lady Members who are not financial at the 1st March 2016 are ineligible for Club events.

Friday's event is 9 hole Stableford.

There is a Ladies Competition on Saturdays. The event will be the Men's event of the day.

Ladies can enter on the timesheet in the Pro Shop on all days.

The Match Committee determine the conditions relative to those competitions or, in the event of unforeseen circumstances, can revise them on the day.

On payment of Green and Competition fees, visitors are eligible to compete in regular competition, excluding Major Club Events

Handicapping

All cards returned in competition are to be used for handicapping purposes. Golf Link is used for maintaining all records.

Block Entry

A fee of \$16 is paid by Lady Members who wish to be eligible to play in the Major Events as displayed on the noticeboard in Ladies' locker room and defined below. This must be paid by the first day of the Wednesday Winter Competition. New members joining the Club during the season may pay after that date.

SGC Lady Medallist of the Year

The winner of the Medal will be decided by the lowest nett aggregate of the **FOUR** best scores selected from the **SIX** Stroke rounds designated the syllabus. In the event of a tie, a playoff over 18 holes on the next Stroke round will decide the winner. If a tie remains then 3, 6 or 9 holes will be played with the proportion of the handicap adjusted until a decision is reached.

Putting Aggregate

Trophy Donated by Veronica Minogue

Played in conjunction with the **SIX** Medal rounds. The winner will be decided by the lowest aggregate of the **FOUR** best putting rounds. In the event of a tie, a countback over the last round will decide the winner.

Championships

Trophies donated by Strategic Wealth Planning.

There are four grades contested in the Ladies Club Championships and two events run in conjunction with them.

SGC Club Championship (Matt Dunstan Cup)

Open to all Lady Members

"B" Grade Championship (E.D.Guyatt Cup)

"C" Grade Championship (E.Nankervis Cup)

"D" Grade Championship (Purdey's Hourglass Jewellers Cup)

All Lady Members are eligible to enter the Open Division. A Grade 0-18, B and C Grade divided equally between 19-35, D Grade 36-45. The handicaps for B and C grade will be announced before the first round and will stay the same for all rounds. The Match Committee reserves the right to alter the handicap sections and to alter the D Grade format in the week prior to the Championships. Should a player from a lower grade qualify for the Open Event that player has the option of contesting the Open Championship.

All Qualifying, Semi-final and Final Rounds must be played from the Medal Marks. All Championship Divisions will be played over **TWO** Qualifying Stroke Scratch rounds.

The **FOUR** top qualifiers will compete for the SGC Ladies Championship. Ties for the first three positions will be decided by countback – ties for the fourth place will be decided by a three-hole playoff over holes 10, 11 and 12.

There will be **FOUR** qualifiers in B and C Grades – ties will be decided by countback. There will be 4 qualifiers in D Grade if 4 are not available the top 2 will play off in the final. If there is only 1 qualifier there would be no championship awarded that year.

The Final of the SGC Ladies' Championship is 36-hole Match play. All other Finals and Semi-finals are 18 hole Match play. If the score is square, all matches continue hole by hole until a decision is reached.

There are two events run in conjunction with the first two rounds of the Club Championships which are played as follows:-

Ties are decided by countback over the second round and Handicaps remain as at the beginning of the first round.

Aggregate Handicap Trophy

Trophy donated by the Pegg Family

The winner will be the player with the lowest nett aggregate score after the two qualifying rounds.

Veterans Championship (Max Gaylard Tray)

Trophy donated by Mrs Jeanne Dainton

The winner will be the player aged 55 or over at the date of the first round with the lowest nett aggregate score. The eligible competitors must write "Veterans" of "V" on their first round card.

There are three Aggregate Awards

Jean Turnbull Aggregate Par

Trophy donated by the Jean Turnbull Trust

On Consecutive Wednesdays, **TWO** 18-hole Par rounds conducted as listed in the syllabus played from medal marks. Handicaps remain as at the beginning of the first round. The winner will be the player with the best aggregate Par score. In the event of a tie, a playoff over 18 holes on the following Friday after the second round will decide the winner. If a tie remains, the round will continue hole by hole until a decision is reached.

Dinah Gaylard Points Trophy

Trophy donated by Jeremy & Felicity Gaylard

SIX rounds – **TWO** Stroke, **TWO** Stableford and **TWO** Par – conducted as listed in the syllabus. Points scoring 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 & 1 – with ties remaining – are allocated. The winner will be the player with the best aggregate score. In the event of a tie, a playoff over 18 holes on the next Stroke round will decide the winner. If a tie remains then 3, 6 or 9 holes will be played with the proportion of the Handicap adjusted until a decision is reached.

Edna Barnet Consistency Award
