COURSE & GREENS

Projects afoot: After much deliberation and consultation, we are pleased to announce two projects given full approval by the General Committee to commence in the medium future. When completed, the two undermentioned projects will greatly improve the safety element of golfers on the 15th green and enhance the appearance of the motel frontage.

16th Safety Fence: For many months now, perhaps years, the subject of this fence to protect golfers chipping or putting on the 15th green has been a contentious issue and the cause of many debates. We acknowledge the efforts of previous attempts by the club to erect the existing fence but it is largely agreed that the dangers of further mishaps will continue unless further action is taken to extend this fence higher and longer using specialized materials viz: manufactured adjustable poles and appropriate golf course netting frequently used on golf courses around the world. Such a concern for the safety of golfers has prompted the North family, spearheaded by dedicated member Graeme to generously tackle this venture with the help of volunteers at no cost to the club...a worthy gesture indeed. Thanks a million, Graeme.

Motel Oval Garden Bed: This project has been carefully studied over recent months by both the G & C and General Committee with the presentation of several plans in order to make this feature a real showpiece. Eventually, approval has been given to Cheryl and Phil Mahon's very generous offer to cut out 5mm thick steel golfing figurines of various heights and installed in three dimensional positions in the oval bed, somewhat similar to those at the front of the sports stadium. When erected, the bed will be landscaped accordingly to create an appealing sight for visitors and golfers alike. All expenses will be borne by our fantastic supporting bodies. (Ladies & Lunch Groups.) We thank them dearly for their valued contribution.

Shed Construction update: There has been concrete poured in half the staff amenities area (the current position of the toilets has meant that the remaining area will be poured at a later stage) and the wash down and chemical area. There are approximately two bays to pour which will occur once the new staff amenities have been built and the remainder of the original shed removed. The building of the staff amenities area will commence in about four weeks. (A combination of concrete curing and Lloyd Ohlin being unavailable is the reason for this time frame.) Initial plumbing of the wash area will occur once the concrete fully cures. Lloyd is organizing to build sliding doors to enable the wash area to be locked. The course staff have boxed and levelled the bays in preparation for the concrete.

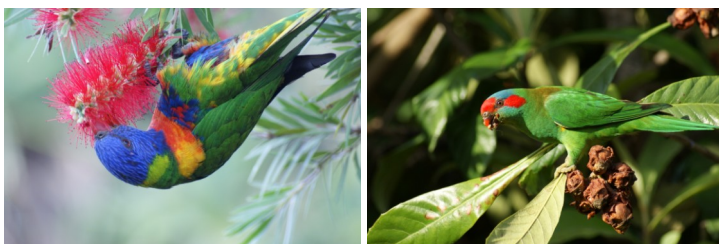
