Course and Greens

The waterline from the irrigation system to the shed to meet the CFA regulations has been installed, with the assistance of a merry band of volunteers. A thank you to these people who gave up their time before the more important issues of playing golf occurred. Their scores may have reflected that day as considerable work was completed before they all had to depart. Other aspects of the shed construction are progressing. We would also like to acknowledge the efforts of the volunteers who were involved in the resurfacing of the third path. It has provided a smoother surface on which to walk and drive.

On the course the 16th men's tee has been sprayed in preparation for the tee to be re-leveled. This will provide a flatter surface which will enable more area on the tee to be used, and assist in some of the members not getting vertigo as they pick up their tees.

The second tee has had part of its surface re-grassed. This comes with thanks from the Waaia Cricket Club who had excess grass left over from the resurfacing of their pitches. This area will be out of play for some weeks which will restrict the teeing area. We ask that members be patient during this time and not to use it until official notification from the pro shop has been received. John Harris also provided some grass which has been used in several of the stump holes.

In closing on course matters just a reminder that volunteers will be required on the 19th September when the greens are cored. As has been the practice in the past a barbeque will be put on once the works have been completed. We look forward to your assistance

As people may or may not be aware, Malcolm Brady a past employee of the club was accepted as an intern in the Ohio program, which is a program that enables apprentices as they completed their qualification to work on some of the more exclusive course's in the USA. The following is an extract of where he is working and the experiences he has had.

In March I flew from Melbourne to Ohio to start my internship in America, I was in Ohio for 3 nights to do some paper work and enroll in the college, I got a tour around the campus which houses 60000 plus students.

I flew into Washington DC and was met there by the superintendent of the golf course and was taken to the course to meet the crew, my house mate and another intern. The superintendent is an Australian that did the internship that I am doing.

The course I am at is part of the TPC (Tournament Players Club) which is owned by the PGA. My course is called TPC Potomac at Avenal Farm, this course is a really big income for the TPC organization as we are in Washington DC and have up to 30000 rounds a year.

I am living in Virginia with the third in charge with another Australian Intern from Perth, this is his second course he did first 6 months at TPC Scottsdale in Arizona,

The course look that they go for is a very natural one, so long native rough and open areas, we walk mow everything apart from fairways and rough. We can mow change holes and organize the course in front of the first group if we are an hour head start,

In June I worked at the US Open at Congressional Country Club. The week was hectic/long/boring/interesting/fun. The hours we worked were up at 3am to be at the course to start working at 4, my morning job for the week was to mow fairways which was good, and my afternoon job was to mow the creek bed on the 11th everyday then drive round the course and collect all the tee markers and flags. There were so many volunteers from all over the place. I meet a lot of people, lots of contacts for the future also.

I have picked up a lot of new tricks that can help me with my future and also to share with Bill and the boys back home,

I am in the process of organizing my next placement I am pretty sure I am going to be going to work at Doral, the course is called Blue Monster it holds the world championships every year which is said to be the fifth major so that should be an experience living in Miami working at a really good course and having the chance to work at a pro event not just being a volunteer.
