## Dress Requirements

### Ladies:

Permitted On Course:

Tailored pants, <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> pants, shorts or skirts of a reasonable length.

Suitable golf shirts with or without a collar are acceptable.

Please consider sun smart wear.

### NOT PERMITTED ON COURSE

Tracksuit apparel, tank tops or singlets

Footwear

Soft spikes only on the course.

Shoes worn on the course are not permitted in the clubhouse

**Gentlemen:** Thongs, scuffs and workboots are not considered appropriate footwear on or off the course or in the Clubhouse. Tee shirts, singlets, track suit apparel, football shorts, running shorts, surf gear, football socks and football jumpers are not considered suitable dress on the course or in the Clubhouse. Predominately white sports socks must be worn with walk shorts on the course. Leather sandals with or without socks may be worn in the Clubhouse.

**Golf Shoes On course** – Soft spikes only.

**Buggies On Greens** – It is permissible to take buggies across a green and, if this is done players should not go near the hole and are particularly requested to spread the wear on greens by avoiding the most common or shortest route across the particular green, and also to avoid wearing tracks around the edges of the green and bunkers. Members are also requested to avoid using the same route across the greens. Under no circumstances should buggies be left on greens while putting or be taken across or left on tees.

### Golf Carts- Requirements of the SGC

\*Current medical certificate, stating precise reason for needing a cart, is required.

\*Current liability insurance. Proof supplied annually to the Club 1<sup>st</sup> October. The operator is responsible for operating the cart in a safe and careful manner and is liable for damage to persons or property caused by operator's negligence.

\*Cart be maintained in sound condition.

\*Committee reserves the right to limit the occasions and competitions in which motorized vehicles may be used. Advice will be communicated through the golf center on a daily basis.

\*Committee retains the authority to cancel any member's licence if it feels there is improper use.

\*Private carts are for exclusive use by the owner only. ie. **NO** lending of carts.

\*Upon sale of the cart, the rights for storage does not go with the sale.

## Playing Rights

### **-ALL PLAYERS MUST REPORT TO THE PRO SHOP PRIOR TO PLAYING-**

**Members** are reminded that their rights to play on the course are not restricted, except for the days listed in this programme as "Open" or GVDGA, GVLGA events, Charity or Trade Days.

**Lady Members** – On every Wednesday from 1<sup>st</sup> March to 31<sup>st</sup> October, Lady members have prior rights on all tees from 8.30am to 2.00 pm or until later to allow the competition to proceed and from 1<sup>st</sup> November to 28<sup>th</sup> February rights from 7.00 a.m. until competition is completed.

**Summer Members** - Playing rights on the course are restricted to the months of October to March inclusive, however, they are entitled to use the Clubhouse facilities throughout the year.

### **Conduct Of Competitions And Conditions Of Entry**

1. All competitors must be available for starting five minutes before the appointed time.
2. Twelve players required before trophy can be played for.
3. Place card in the result box without undue delay at completion of round.
4. During summer months (9 hole event excepted) competitors must complete round and lodge cards by 6.00 pm
5. Summer members are eligible for all events during months they are permitted to play on the course.
6. Visitors MAY at the discretion of the match Committee play in club Events on payment of required fees. During the months of April to October inclusive, visitors are to hit off prior to 9.00 am and Members' Guests may play in the afternoon field if there is a vacancy after 7.30 pm on the Friday evening prior to the event, and are eligible to win the days event except monthly medal and honour board events, on producing membership and handicap details.
7. Unfinancial members are not eligible for competition from 1<sup>st</sup> December, 2009.
8. Grades: 0-59 players – 1 Grade; 60 to 99 players – 2 grades; 100 + players – 3 grades

### **Entry Fees**

The following will apply:

1. Saturday - \$7 per player, \$14 per pair in teams events
2. Tuesday & Thursday events - \$7 per player. Competitions open to visitors
3. Mixed Foursomes Events and Sunday four Ball Events – \$14 per pair
4. Anzac Day. Proceeds to RSL - \$7 per player
5. Shepparton Four Ball - \$4 per pair (plus daily event)
6. Championship - \$3 per player (on first round)

## Junior Golf

A junior is eligible to join the Club upon reaching 11 years of age. Younger children may play the course in the company of their parent members at no cost. The junior clinic commences on Sunday 11th April, 2010 member and non member juniors are encouraged to attend. Junior members may be given permission to compete in all events on application to the Match Committee. Unless advised otherwise juniors are required to commence play prior to 12 noon on Saturdays and should not include more than two juniors in each foursome.

## Procedure In The Event Of A Tied Match

Halved match or stroke play ties shall be replayed unless the Match Committee considers this not to be expedient, when ties shall be decided as follows:

1. MATCH PLAY –
  - (a) SCRATCH EVENTS: A match which ends all square shall be continued hole by hole from the hole where the match began until one side wins a hole.
  - (b) HANDICAP EVENTS: As in Scratch Events, but with the strokes being allowed as if the match has been recommenced.
2. STROKE PLAY –
  - (a) For 18 hole events the best score for the last 9 holes shall be used, if there is still a tie, the last 6 holes or if still tied the last 3 holes. If a tie still persists then hole by hole from the 18<sup>th</sup>.
  - (b) In 27, 36, 54 and 72 hole events the last 18 holes shall be used and if still tied countback as in (a) above.
  - (c) In handicap events the relevant handicap or fraction thereof shall be applied.
  - (d) Where a penalty applicable under rule 3-5 of the Rules of golf is applied to a result this penalty shall be ignored so far as the countback is concerned.

*NOTE: For a 9 hole event the best score for the last 6holes shall be used if there is still a tie the last 3 holes, if a tie still persists then hole by hole from the 9<sup>th</sup> hole*

## Handicaps

Members without handicaps are required to lodge five completed cards. The failure of Members to lodge cards may result in the withdrawal or halving of handicaps.

For all events handicaps will be as at day of play.

In mixed Canadian Foursomes events, handicap is 3/8 of the combined handicap of players.

## Rules Of Play For Club Championships

The Club Championship will consist of three qualifying rounds of eighteen holes stroke play, followed by Match Play. In the Club Championships 8<sup>th</sup> qualifier will

be decided by a sudden death play off on the Sunday morning prior to the quarter finals commencing. In B, C, D grades all ties for qualifiers will be decided by countback. All matches over 18 holes except the final of the Club championship, which will be over 36 holes. Eligibility to compete in the Club Championships requires a male member whose home club is other than Shepparton Golf Club, to have played a minimum of five competitive singles rounds at the Shepparton Golf Club in the twelve months prior to the entry closing date. In exceptional circumstances permission to compete may be granted on application to the Match Committee.

Open – eight qualifiers

B Division – Handicaps 10-14, eight qualifiers

C Division – Handicaps 15-21, eight qualifiers

D Division – Handicaps 22-26, eight qualifiers

All play will be under medal round conditions. Players commencing in A, B or C divisions will remain in that Division, except in the case of a players qualifying for the Club championship. A draw from 7.00 a.m. will be made for the first qualifying round. Entries close at 6.00 p.m. on Sunday 26/4/2009

### **Junior Championship**

Best aggregate score over three qualifying rounds by players under 18 years of age at date of first round.

### **Veteran Championship**

Best aggregate score over three qualifying rounds by a player aged 55 or over at date of first round.

### **Honour Board Evens**

GMCU Fourball, Captain's Trophy, RSL Trophy, legacy Trophy, H.F. Lightfoot Mixed Canadian Foursomes, Lawton Family Perpetual Trophy.

### **Special Events**

*\*Denotes Monthly Medal*

**Medallist of the Year** to be played in conjunction with Lawton Family Perpetual Trophy. Twelve medal winners to play off, lowest nett score on the day to be the winner. Trophy to be known as the LAWTON FAMILY PERPETUAL TROPHY.

### **Shepparton Four Ball -**

Trophies provided by GMCU – Eligibility to compete in the Shepparton Four Ball requires a male member whose home club is other than Shepparton Golf Club, to have played a minimum of five competitive singles rounds excluding handicap cards at the Shepparton Golf Club in the twelve months prior to the entry closing date. In

exceptional circumstances, permission to compete, may be granted on application to the Match Committee

Time Sheet available in Pro Shop for qualifying round to be played on Saturday 14/3/2009. All play under medal round conditions. The leading 32 pairs qualify for knockout match play. Summer members cannot qualify for this event. Lowest marker in each match reduces to scratch and other players reduce their handicaps by the same number of strokes. The match is four ball best ball handicap match play. Maximum handicap 27.

**The KFC – Chicken Run** – From November until the end of March a 9 hole Stableford event will be conducted on Wednesdays. In conjunction with this event a special competition will be conducted by the Club Professional. Entry in this event is subject to entry in the ball competition.

### **Medal Rounds**

Medal rounds are played from the back tees over the full length of the course and are the only rounds when the course record may be challenged.

### **Rules for Ambrose Play**

A team stroke event usually played by a group of four, but can be any number. Each player plays a tee shot at each hole. The captain then selects the best drive which is then played by its owner. The other Members retrieve their balls and in turn place with one club-length of the selected position and play their second shots. This procedure of selecting the best position continues until a ball is holed. When on the green, balls are placed on the selected spot. The score for the team on each hole is the best score of any of its players. In the interest of speedy play, it is imperative that each team appoints a team captain (usually the lowest marker) whose duty it is to select the ball to be played and generally to direct the order of play of the other players in the team.

### **Starting Time Sheets**

A time sheet will be posted in the Pro Shop on the Monday of the week prior to the event. Members should arrange their own bookings. Saturday morning bookings or cancellations should be made direct to the Pro shop ph: 5821 2531. Pro shop trading hours:- Standard time: Monday – Friday 8am-5.30pm Saturday/Sunday 7am – 5.30pm  
Daylight Saving time: Monday-Friday 8am-7pm Saturday/Sunday 7am-7pm

### **Hole In One**

On the occasion of a member holing in one during competition, it will be the pleasure of the Club to suitably celebrate with the member present.

## Practice

Practice on the course is not permitted at any time. A member may play a round hitting a second ball. On the practice fairway play should only be from designated areas and be limited to 6,7, 8 & 9 irons and wedge.

## Complaints

All complaints should be made in writing to the Club Secretary, who if unable to satisfy them, will submit them to the Executive Committee. No member shall directly reprimand an employee of the Club.

## Car Parking

Members are requested to strictly observe the parking rules. The areas marked for the Committee of the Club are reserved for them at all times. Ladies Committee members may use parking areas on Wednesdays only. **The President, Captain, Lady President, Lady Captain and Administration Secretary parking area is reserved for them only at all times. *Parking bays in front of the motel are for motel guests only.***

## Members' Guests and Visitors

Members' guests and visitors are welcome at Shepparton Golf Club and are asked to comply with the Club's dress and behavioural code.

## Liquor

The SGC is the holder of a Full Club Licence and can trade daily. The hours are determined by the management but generally the bar is open from 11am to 7pm. These hours may be varied according to demand. The sale of liquor to persons under age of 18 years is not permitted. Liquor purchased elsewhere is not permitted to be consumed on course or in clubhouse.

THE CONSUMPTION OF LIQUOR ON THE COURSE SHOULD BE LIMITED SO AS NOT TO CAUSE DISRUPTION TO PLAY NOR OFFENCE TO FELLOW GOLFERS.

### **LADY MEMBERS**

#### ***Conditions of Competition***

Hit off times. 9.00am start June, July & August. 8.30am start all other times. (Subject to change during daylight saving).

In the event of forced alterations to the published syllabus due to unforeseen circumstances, the Match Committee will revise the conditions of competition.

Lady Members who are not financial at 1<sup>st</sup> March 2010 are ineligible for Club events.

#### ***Club Competition***

Wednesday is Club Competition day. Play will be in three (3) Divisions. Division 1. 0-20; Division 2 21-28; Division 3 29-45. Ties will be decided by Countback.

Additional competitions will be conducted on Fridays and Saturdays.

The Match Committee will determine the conditions relative to those competitions or as decided by the Match Committee on the day of Competition.

Maximum Club Handicap will be 45.

### **Visitors**

On payment of Green and Competition fees, visitors are eligible to compete in regular competition, excluding Major Club Events.

#### ***Saturday Golf***

Saturday golf is available to Lady Members. A Lady Member may indicate her intention to play by entering her name on the time sheet in the Pro Shop. Entry is paid at the Pro Shop. The event will be the Mens event on that day, except that Fourball events will become a singles event for the Ladies.

#### ***Handicapping***

Upon request the Handicap Manager will issue a WGA Handicap Certificate showing the exact Handicap of that player. All cards returned in competition play is to be used for Handicapping purposes. Golf Link is used to maintain all records.

### ***Block Entry***

A block entry of \$16 is to be paid by Lady members by the first day of the Winter Competition. This fee covers entry into all Club and Major events listed in the Syllabus. A pro-rata fee will be offered to new members joining during the season.

#### ***SGC Lady Medallist of the Year***

The winner will be decided by the nett aggregate of the four (4) best scores selected from the six (6) designated Stroke rounds listed in the syllabus. In the event of a tie a playoff over 18 holes on the next Stroke round will decide the winner. If a tie remains then three (3), six (6) or nine (9) holes will be played with the proportion of the Handicap adjusted until a decision is reached.

### ***SGC Club Championship (Matt Dunstan Cup)***

Open to all Lady members

### ***“B” Grade Championship (E.D.Guyatt Cup)***

19-27 Handicap

### ***“C” Grade Championship (E.Nankervis Cup)***

28-36 Handicap

### ***“D” Grade Championship (Purdey’s Hourglass Jewellers Cup)***

37-45 Handicap

*N.B. Unless there is a minimum of 8 players wishing to enter D grade, there will not be a championship for this grade.*

Entry into the Championships is automatic upon payment of the BLOCK ENTRY. Play will be from the Medal Marks

SGC Lady Members holding a WGA Handicap are eligible to enter the Championships.

All Championship Divisions will play over TWO (2) qualifying rounds.

The FOUR (4) top qualifiers will compete for the SGC Ladies Club Championship.

Ties for the first three(3) qualifying positions will be decided by countback.

In the event of a tie for fourth place a play off over three (3) holes will occur.

There will be four qualifiers in Divisions B , C and D.

Ties for qualifying positions in these Divisions will be decided by countback.

Handicap qualifications are as at the beginning of the first round.

All Semi-finals will be conducted over 18 holes. The Final of the Open Championship will be Match Play over 36 holes, then hole by hole until a decision is reached. B, C and D Divisions will be decided by Match Play over 18 holes, then hole by hole until a decision is reached.

### ***Aggregate Handicap Trophy***

***(Trophy donated by Annie McCrabb)***

Conducted in conjunction with the two(2) qualifying Championship rounds. The winner will be the player with the lowest nett aggregate. Handicap will remain as at the commencement of the first round. In the event of a tie, a countback over the second 18 holes will decide the winner. Entry is automatic upon payment of the BLOCK ENTRY - BUT the player must play in the Championships to be eligible.

### ***Veteran’s Championship (Max Gaylard tray)***

***(Trophy donated by Mrs.Jeanne.Dainton)***

Conducted in conjunction the two (2) qualifying Championship rounds the winner shall be the player with the lowest nett aggregate. Handicap will remain as at the commencement of the first round. In the event of a tie, a countback over the second 18 holes will decide the winner. Entry is automatic upon payment of the BLOCK ENTRY – BUT the player must play in the Championships to be eligible.

### ***Putting Aggregate***

Played in conjunction with the Medal rounds. The four (4) best putting rounds will be selected to count. In the event of a tie a countback over the last round will decide the winner.

Played on consecutive Wednesdays the winner shall be the player with the best aggregate Par score over two (2) rounds conducted on the days listed in the syllabus. If a tie remains the decision will be reached by playing hole by hole. Handicap to remain as at the commencement of the first round

Entry is automatic upon payment of the BLOCK ENTRY. Qualifying listed in syllabus, best 8 players to qualify. Conditions of play will be as displayed on the Notice Board .

***McKeon Fourball Championship Knockout***  
***Trophy donated by Rex and Jill Collard***

Entry is automatic upon payment of the BLOCK ENTRY. Qualifying listed in syllabus, best 8 pairs to qualify. Conditions of play will be as displayed on the Notice Board .

The winner shall be the player with the best Stableford score recorded on Captains Day. In the event of a tie a countback will decide the winner.

***SGC Foursomes Championships***  
***( Shepparton Trophy Centre Cup )***

Played over 36 holes , the winners shall be the pair with the best Scratch Score . In the event of a tie, a sudden death playoff over holes 10,11 and 12 will decide the winning pair.

***Lesley Barassi Foursomes Handicap***

Played in conjunction with the SGC Foursomes Championships, the winners will be the pair with the best 36 hole net score.

Half the combined Handicap will apply, the half to be used where applicable.

In the event of a tie a countback over the last 18 holes will decide the winning pair.

***Dinah Gaylard Points Trophy***  
***( Trophy donated by Jeremy & Felicity Gaylard )***

Conducted over 2 Stroke , 2 Stableford and 2 Par rounds as designated in the syllabus. The winner will be decided by the aggregate points scored by the player in those designated rounds. In the event of a tie there will be a deciding round of a further 18 holes on the next Stroke round, then 3, 6 ,9 holes with the proportion of handicap adjusted until a decision is reached. Points scoring of 6,5,4,3,2,1 based on NOMINATED DAYS during the Winter program. In the event of a tie, the tie will remain.

## **Edna Barnet Consistency Award**

*( Trophy donated by the Barnet Family)*

All Lady Members are automatically entered into this event. Points scoring of 4 , 3 , 2 , 1 based on all individual Wednesday events during the Winter program. In the event of a tie, the tie will remain.

## **Thomas Jewellers Cup**

*( Trophy donated by Thomas Jewellers )*

Stroke play over 18 holes for teams of **four with the best three scores to count** .The winning team will have the lowest aggregate nett score. In the event of a tie a countback utilising the best three (3) team members scores over the last 9 ,6, 3 or 1 holes . Further ties on the first 9 , 6, 3 or 1 holes.

Substitutes to teams are allowable.

## **Eclectic Competition**

The eclectic operates on each individual Wednesday competition of the Winter Program. Eclectic adjustment will be permitted if a round is **not** completed, but the score card must be signed , countersigned by the marker and posted in the usual manner. Fourball best ball rounds are not included.

Changes must be recorded on the Eclectic cards on the day , dated and countersigned by a fellow competitor.

Full handicap will apply.

Four Divisions will apply Division 1( 0-18) , Division 2 (19-28) , Division 3(29 – 36) , Division 4 (37- 45) .

During the Winter program there will be an Eclectic Competition conducted for the Saturday competition. It will be only one Division.Conditions as above.

### ***Summer Competition***

The competition from the end of the Winter Syllabus until the last Wednesday of February inclusive will be conducted by the Club Professional.

Entry fee will include the Ball Competition.

Entry will be on the timesheet housed in the Pro Shop.

Competitions will be set by the Professional.

Trophies and Divisions will be dependent upon the number of players on the day.

Divisions will be determined by the Professional.

### ***Summer Eclectic***

The summer eclectic competition will be conducted from the end of the Winter Syllabus until the last Wednesday of February inclusive. A player may improve her score during play on any competition day. Fourball best ball competitions are not included. Improved scores must be recorded on the Eclectic card, dated and countersigned by a fellow competitor on the day of play.

### ***Summer Chicken Run***

An ***all day*** nine (9) hole competition will be conducted on Fridays from the first Friday in November until the last Friday in February. Players can enter using the timesheet in the Pro shop from 0800 hrs or arrange her playing partners to play at any time on Friday. In conjunction all players are automatically entered in the Summer Points Aggregate. Points will be allocated on a 3, 2, 1 system. In the event of a tie the winner will be decided by a countback over the most wins.

### **GVLGA Brooch**

The winner will be the player who has the best nett on the designated event in the Syllabus. In the event of a tie a countback will decide the winner . This player will receive a GVLGA memento.

The winner and those players with the same nett score are eligible to represent the Club at the GVLGA 36 Hole Championships , competing against other GVLGA club winners.

### ***Foundation for Young Australians Event (formerly QE Event)***

An 18 hole Stableford event will be conducted on a designated day listed in the Syllabus. Together with the Mens' winner they will compete in a GV qualifying event. District winners will compete in the Final held at Royal Melbourne Golf Club

### **Womens Golf Victoria Events**

#### ***WGA International Bowl***

An 18 Hole Stroke Handicap event conducted on three (3) designated days listed in the Syllabus . A competitor is entitled to return cards in one or all three (3) days.

The player in Silver and Bronze with the lowest nett score in relation to the Course Rating will be the Club winner and their score will become part of the State Competition.

The International Bowl is presented by the WGA and is held by the Club of the State winner in the Silver Division for the first six (6) months and by the Club winner of the Bronze Division for the second six (6) months.

#### ***Mona McLeod Brooch***

A 36 Hole Stroke Handicap event will be conducted over two (2) designated days listed in the Syllabus.

One (1) Brooch will be presented for both Silver and Bronze Divisions for players in Country Regions.

***Entry fee:*** To be eligible a player must have entered either the Silver Spoon Event or the International Bowl Event.

#### ***Doris Chambers Foursomes Cup***

A Stableford Foursomes event conducted over 18 Holes. In the event of a tie the winners will be decided by a countback over the last nine (9) holes.

Club winners or the next available pair are eligible to compete in either of the two (2) Final Rounds played on a Metropolitan course. Dates to be decided by the WGA. The Doris Chambers Cup will be held by the winners at each course for a six (6) month period.

### ***Silver Spoon Competition***

SGC will conduct four(4) qualifying rounds on designated days listed in the Syllabus. In the event of a tie all players shall be eligible to play in the Final round to decide the eventual winner. The same player may win any number of the qualifying rounds.

The winners of the qualifying rounds will play off in a Final round which is designated in the Syllabus. The winner shall be the player with the lowest nett score. In the event of a tie in the Final round the winner shall be decided by a countback over the last nine (9) holes.

She shall receive a Silver Spoon donated by the WGV. The winner is eligible to represent SGC for the case of spoons , played on a Metropolitan Course . The date to be set by the WGV.
